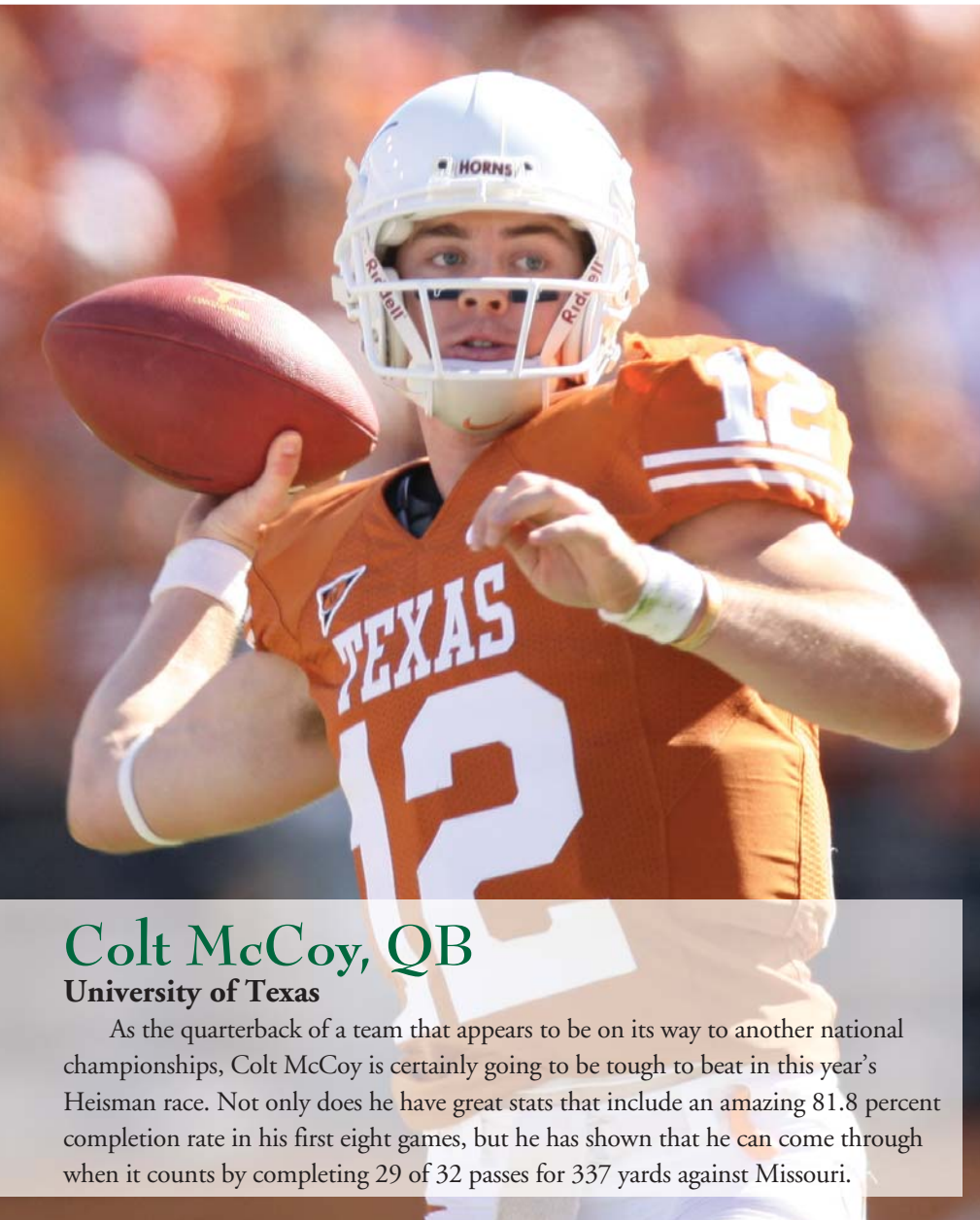
A look at another unpredictable Heisman Trophy race

With Florida's Tim Tebow winning the Heisman Trophy Award last year as a sophomore, you might think he would be the logical choice to once again

win college football's most prestigious award. But not so fast!

After Florida's stunning upset by unranked Mississippi on September 27 and with Tebow being well behind

the pace that enabled him to throw for 3,286 yards last year, many sports writers have placed Texas's Colt McCoy, Missouri's Chase Daniel and Texas Tech's Graham Harrell as the



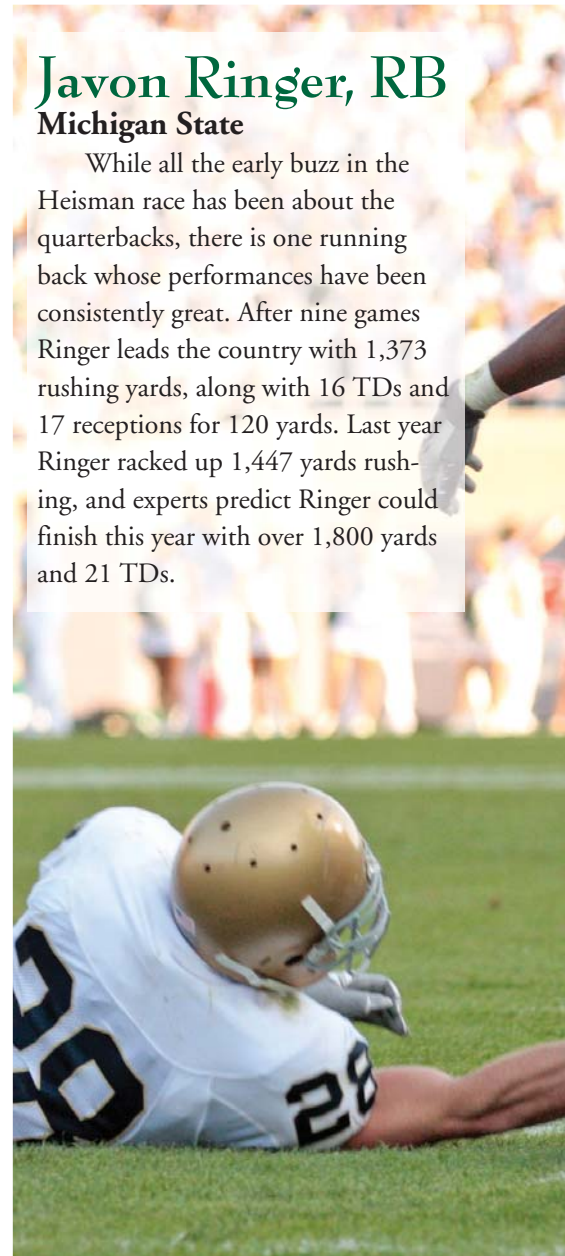
Colt McCoy, QB University of Texas

As the quarterback of a team that appears to be on its way to another national championships, Colt McCoy is certainly going to be tough to beat in this year's Heisman race. Not only does he have great stats that include an amazing 81.8 percent completion rate in his first eight games, but he has shown that he can come through when it counts by completing 29 of 32 passes for 337 yards against Missouri.

Javon Ringer, RB Michigan State

While all the early buzz in the Heisman race has been about the quarterbacks, there is one running back whose performances have been consistently great. After nine games Ringer leads the country with 1,373 rushing yards, along with 16 TDs and 17 receptions for 120 yards. Last year Ringer racked up 1,447 yards rushing, and experts predict Ringer could finish this year with over 1,800 yards and 21 TDs.




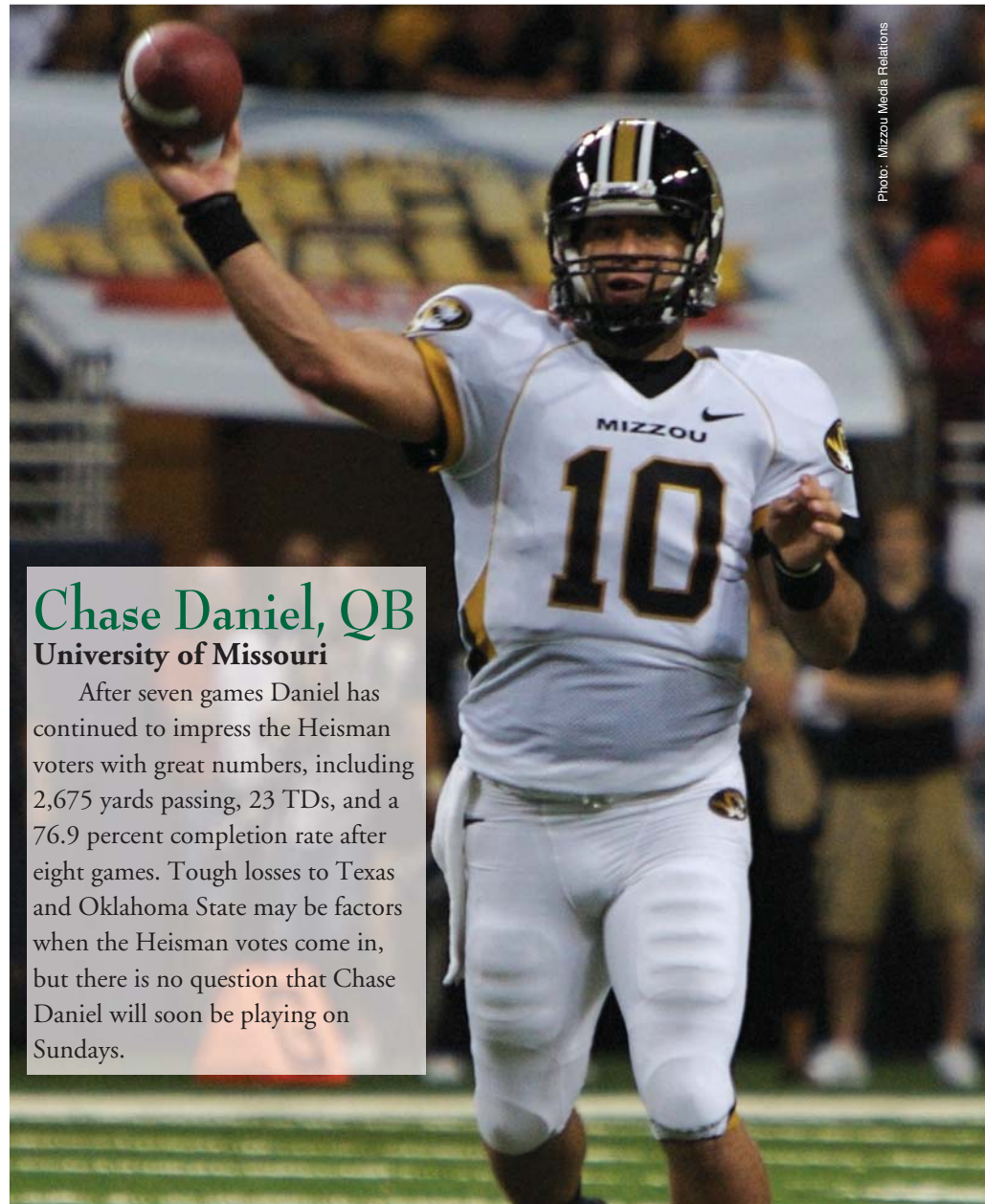

Chase Daniel, QB University of Missouri

After seven games Daniel has continued to impress the Heisman voters with great numbers, including 2,675 yards passing, 23 TDs, and a 76.9 percent completion rate after eight games. Tough losses to Texas and Oklahoma State may be factors when the Heisman votes come in, but there is no question that Chase Daniel will soon be playing on Sundays.

Graham Harrell, QB

Texas Tech

Graham Harrell had a great year in 2007, passing for 5,705 yards and 48 touchdowns. And while last year was a great season that included a bowl victory and nine wins, this season Harrell is leading his team to a possibly better year, as after eight games they were undefeated. As for his 2008 numbers, Harrell has a 71.1 percent completion rate and has passed for 3,147 yards and 28 touchdowns.

Michael Crabtree, WR

Texas Tech

Graham Harrell is certainly in the national spotlight, and one reason is the outstanding performance of wide receiver Michael Crabtree. Last year Crabtree gained 1,962 yards, averaging 14.6 yards a catch, and made 22 TDs. And he is having another great year, as after eight games he has racked up 794 yards and 14 TDS and is averaging 13.2 yards a catch.

Max Hall, QB

Brigham Young University

BYU has enjoyed a great season that included shutouts against UCLA (59-0) and Wyoming (44-0) and a 7-1 record. Leading the charge for the Cougars is Max Hall, a junior quarterback who after eight games has thrown for 2,364 yards and 24 touchdowns.

HEISMAN HISTORY

One of the most coveted awards in college sports is the Heisman Memorial Trophy Award. The Heisman, which was first awarded in 1935, is given at the end of the regular season to the young man considered the best player in college football. The award is presented at the end of the year by the Downtown Athletic Club of New York City.

The Heisman is named for John W. Heisman, the first athletic director of

the Downtown Athletic Club of New York City. As for the voting process, the nation is split into six sections (Northeast, Mid-Atlantic, South, Midwest, Southwest, Far West), each consisting of 175 media voters culled from the print, radio and television ranks.

Also, every past Heisman winner casts a vote as well. Each elector casts a ballot listing his top three choices, with the top choice receiving three points,

the second receiving two and the third receiving one. This method was adopted with the idea of eliminating regional favoritism, and the player receiving the highest number of points across all six sections is the winner.

Here are the past recipients of all Heisman Trophies. Many names you will recognize as athletes who have gone on to successful careers in the NFL.
